



CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES



LANGUAGE LAB

Our Language Laboratory is fitted with latest multimedia equipment and audio-visual aids. Students practice speaking a new language, record their work and take part in interactive sessions to improve their language skills while enjoying the experience.

COMPUTER LAB

The Computer Lab is equipped with high-speed central servers and the latest educational software (with adequate security and safety features). Every student has access to a terminal in the lab. We also educate children about personal safety while using social media to ensure they are fully aware of the health and social risks involved. Parents can access up-to-date progress of their children in each subject via the school's website.

SOCIAL SCIENCE LAB

Social Science Laboratory has equipment, apparatus and materials required for each subject, such as maps, globe, ethnic artefacts, etc. to promote practical as well as theoretical learning. It provides a workspace for students and teachers for interactive activities such as role playing, visualisation, competing/cooperating, problem solving or focus group discussions.

E-LIBRARY

In addition to our library we also have an extensive e-library which can be accessed by students from within the school as well as from home. Students use the e-library to prepare presentations of their work which, in turn, also helps them to improve communication skills.






EXCELLENCE IN CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

OUR PROGRESSIVE CURRICULUM

The Curriculum of Delhi World Foundation adheres to the National Curriculum Framework 2005 (NCF 2005) and the CBSE curriculum. The Foundation believes that the classroom experiences of children are to be organised in a manner that permits them to construct knowledge in consonance with the child's nature and context, thus providing equal learning opportunities for all children. Teaching aims at enhancing the child's innate desire and acumen to learn. Activity is at the heart of children's attempt to make sense of the world around them. Therefore, every resource is deployed in a child-centric manner to enable them to express themselves, handle objects, explore their natural and social milieu, and grow up in good health.

Our guiding principles are as follows:

- a) to shift away from rote methods of Teaching and learning
- b) Curriculum to be enriched enough to go beyond textbooks
- c) Teach less to learn more
- d) Opportunities to be created to enhance the ability of a child to link learned content to life outside the school
- e) Examinations to be more flexible and integrated with classroom life
- f) Classroom experience is directed towards becoming good citizens with a sense of equality and compassion for others

SEE Learning Programme (Social, Emotional and Ethical Learning) is the latest programme of His Holiness the Dalai Lama, which is indeed the need of the hour.

This co-created program will provide thrust to children's natural curiosity, social sensitivity, importance of relationships and zest for learning. It will provide opportunities to children to learn through orchestrated balance of play, spontaneous interaction and guided teaching, incorporating active, engaging and challenging experiences.

OUR FACILITATORS

We closely monitor the work of our teachers and review their performance regularly through teacher appraisals to bench mark their knowledge and skills, their attitude and behaviour in the. classroom as well as in the community. We seek regular 360°feedback from our students and parents about our teachers. All staff members of the school take part in Continuous Professional Development (CPD) and adequate resources are allocated to develop their skills.

With in-service training, our teacher's competencies are enhanced. keeping in perspective the global educational trends. We at DWF institutions attach a lot of importance to scientifically researched and actively experimented, innovative learning and teaching strategies, homeschool co-operation and different modes of assessments with a view to enhancing the overall quality of teaching and learning.



OUR PEDAGOGY

Pre-Primary (Nursery, Prep, Classes I & II) Curriculum:

Our pre-primary curriculum focuses on six domains in the early childhood education that are essential for success.

- · Personal, Social and Emotional development
- · Physical well-being and Motor Development
- · Cognitive Development
- · Language and Literacy Development
- · Arts and Creative Development
- · Technology (Computer Play)

To ensure a smooth transition to Primary School, the learning experiences of Preschool are planned in a manner that will help young children adjust better in the primary school and develop an interest in learning.

Primary (Classes III – V) Curriculum:

The aim of our Primary education is to foster children's personality development. In light of this, at the core of the curriculum framework are the four

developmental objectives for young children, namely "Physical Development", "Cognitive and Language Development", "Affective and Social Development"and "Aesthetic Development". These objectives need to be achieved through six learning areas, which are "Language", "Early Mathematics", "Science and Technology", "Self and Society" and "Arts" and Physical Fitness and Health.

At the primary stage, subject areas dealt with are English, Hindi (Second Language), Mathematics, Environmental Studies (EVS), Science, Social Studies, Computer Studies, Life Skills and Arts Education.
